The Queensland University of Technology and the University of Queensland are pleased to host the 27th Conference of the Australian Institutes of Transport Research (CAITR) in Brisbane between **7-9 December 2005**. CAITR provides an opportunity for transport researchers and professionals to meet and discuss their work with peers and colleagues in a supportive and informal environment. The Conference is particularly relevant to recently qualified researchers and students (PhDs, Masters and Undergraduates), providing an opportunity to present work in progress and receive constructive feedback. CAITR also provides research organisations with an opportunity to present a summary of their research activities. The spirit of CAITR is traditionally informal and the conference provides researchers and practitioners opportunities to benefit from open discussion and peer comment.

Call for Abstracts

Papers are now invited on topics related, but not limited to, transport modelling and forecasting; accessibility and mobility; transport sustainability and environmental issues; intelligent transport systems; transport planning, policy and economic issues; traffic operations, management and control; road safety; infrastructure and maintenance; and data and information systems. Abstracts of between 200 and 300 words should be submitted to the Conference Secretariat by **Friday 28 October 2005**. E-mail submissions are preferred (MS Word attachments) and may be sent to ITSLab@uq.edu.au. Submissions must contain the name, affiliation and contact details (including address, telephone number and email) of all authors and should indicate the contact author. For the purposes of posting the papers to the CAITR website, authors are requested to bring electronic copies of their papers (either on CD or USB stick) to be submitted to the registration desk or emailed in advance to the Conference Secretariat.

Registration

The cost of registration is \$140. This includes Conference participation, lunches, morning and afternoon teas, but excludes other meals, conference dinner and accommodation. Delegates are requested to finalise registration by Friday **18 November 2005**. Registration for this conference can be completed on-line from the Conference Website or by completing the attached registration form.

Venue

The conference will be held at the Queensland University of Technology Gardens Point Campus. Further details about lecture theatre locations will be provided on the Conference website.
